## **Proposed Project Details**

### **Project Details**

In this project we will construct an outdoor brick pizza oven for the customer to craft and bake homemade pizzas in his back yard. We intend to use our expertise, to build the fully functional pizza oven that will feature the following build elements, listed in order of bottom to top:

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- Concreate pad base, separate from customers existing concrete patio pad
- Open faced, concrete block base, to allow for the wood fires, and will be finished with stone veneer to mask the concrete block.
- Capstone, base of the pizza oven, that will house the fire brick base for the fire arch
- Fire Arch, fire brick arch
- Dome, the final step that encloses the back of the fire arch, and is finished with a brick veneer.

### **Measures of Success**

What are the measures of success of the project? How will it be determined that the project was a success?

We will measure the success of this project against an established list of criteria, with input from the client. The project will be determined a success if it meets the following:

- Timely completion the customer has allowed for a small adjustment to the timeline of no more than one week.
- Budget the project cannot exceed the established budget by more than 10%.
- Quality of work this represents both quality of the working relationship with the customer and high-quality craftsmanship of the brick pizza oven
- Customer Satisfaction may be influenced by adherence to the other measures of success and ultimately means the customer is highly satisfied with the experience and the final product.

### Constraints

What are the boundaries placed on the project? What limitations or requirements need to be adhered to?

The pizza oven is the final installation that will complete the customer's outdoor fan cave. He is intending to be ready to entertain by Opening Day of the 2026 MLB season.

Key constraints for this project are defined as:

- Site availability: Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. Absolutely no work before or after these hours or weekends.
- Required materials: Procure logo etched bricks to incorporate into the base and flue veneers.
- Build deadline: Project must be completed and ready to operate by MLB Opening Day 2026.
